For DBA, PhD, and Master's Students

## 1. Title Page

Include: Proposed research title, full name, degree program, university and faculty, proposed supervisor (if applicable), and date of submission.

## 2. Abstract (150–250 words)

Provide a concise summary of the research problem, aim, methodology, and expected contribution.

## 3. Introduction and Background

Introduce the research area, provide context, explain why the topic is important, and outline the background of the study.

## 4. Problem Statement

Clearly define the research problem, identify gaps in existing literature or practice, and justify the need for the study.

## 5. Research Aim and Objectives

State one clear research aim and 3–6 measurable research objectives aligned with the problem statement.

## 6. Research Questions or Hypotheses

Present focused research questions (qualitative/mixed methods) or testable hypotheses (quantitative studies).

## 7. Literature Review and Theoretical Framework

Critically review relevant theories, models, and empirical studies. Identify gaps and develop a conceptual or theoretical framework.

## 8. Research Methodology

Explain research philosophy, approach, design, data collection methods, sampling strategy, and data analysis techniques.

## 9. Ethical Considerations

Discuss informed consent, confidentiality, anonymity, data protection, and ethical approval procedures.

## 10. Expected Contribution of the Study

Explain the anticipated theoretical, practical, and/or policy contributions of the research.

## 11. Limitations and Delimitations

Identify potential limitations and define the scope and boundaries of the study.

## 12. Research Timeline

Provide a realistic timeline or Gantt chart outlining key research stages and milestones.

## 13. References

List all sources cited in the proposal using the required academic referencing style.

## 14. Appendices (if applicable)

Include supporting documents such as questionnaires, interview guides, consent forms, or ethics approvals.
